Breakfast club and after school provision

As many of you are aware, we wrote to all parents in October 2021 to inform them that we had been evaluating the possibility of providing a breakfast club and/or an after school childcare provision. Since then, school leaders concluded that we do not currently have any spare capacity to offer after

school provision. This is due to extra-curricular activities taking place after school in the hall, MUGA and some classrooms. As an alternative, we provided details to parents of local childcare providers including Hubbub who pick up children from St Peter's. We have seen a positive response to this and now have a number of Parents using the service offered by Hubbub.

We also undertook a survey to gauge interest from parents for a breakfast club on-site. As a result of the number of positive survey responses, we began to explore the options for this. We have considered a venue for the club, staffing and whether external providers would be keen to assist. We have identified the small annexe at the back of the school hall as a potential space that could be used, but due to the size of the space, numbers would have to be limited. We are currently exploring with existing staff our capacity to supervise children during this time before school and have also been in touch with external childcare providers as an alternative option. Realistically, breakfast club provision will not be in place prior to January, but we do hope that this will be an option in the near future. We will endeavour to keep you abreast of developments as they happen.

Christmas events

As you can see below, the Christmas season is hotting up and already looking very busy. There are a range of events taking place in the coming weeks. A few parents have asked about performances and productions. We have decided that our youngest children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 should perform a nativity in school. This will be repeated on the 14th and 15th December at 9.15am so that 3 adults can attend for each child if required. We have also been liaising with the church about a Christmas service on 12th December, but due to their own number limitations and the increase in our pupil numbers we cannot invite parents to that service. I know that some parents in the older classes may feel disappointed, however it is the intention of the teaching staff to provide performance opportunities later in the school year at a quieter time. The school choir will also be performing at a local care home and at the PTA fair.
